#### **VII. SOCIAL ASSESSMENT:**

#### 7.1) Local Community Participation during Planning and Preparatory Activities.

With the existence of the Mindanao Rural Development Program, the long bean dreamed for a safe potable water supply in barangay Mindulao, Cabalawan, Tibon-Tibon and San Vicente will come to its realization. The water source located on a high elevated area at barangay Mindulao could sufficiently supply the four barangays and will even expand its distribution to nearby barangays in the future. Its actual normal spring discharged for 24 hours in more than enough to supply the maximum day demand of the populace.

The source of potable water supply is located within or inside the ancestral domain with the presence of Indigenous People (IPs), particularly the "Ubod Locos Datu Association (UBLODA) under its chieftain, Datu Makalambog Camilo C. Ratilla, Jr. Several consultations/commitments and endorsement regarding the project, together with other barangay people were made. After thorough discussions and deliberations, majority of the residents of the four barangays showed their willingness and strong support that the Construction of Magsaysay Potable Water Supply Level II will be implemented in their respective barangays.

Most of the people in these 4 barangays are farmers because the area is best suited for agriculture. Their wives (women sector), with the presence of water supply, will lightened the work land of their husbands, because fetching water in a far distance will be minimized. Their wives even their children could do it themselves, hence, they commit to be involved in our project under the MRDP –APL 2.

# 7.2) Right-of-Way:

The proposed sub project has 2 unit Intake Boxes, 3 unit Concrete Reservoirs and 35 unit Communal Faucets, the said structures will be erected on the **donated lots.** The Two (2) Spring Boxes will be erected on the lots donated by Mr. Eleuterio Halaran and Mrs. Conchita Quiloman of Barangay Mindulao. The Three (3) Concrete Reservoirs will be erected on the lots donated Mr. Leonardo Dalogdog for Barangay Mindulao, for barangay Cabalawan the lot is donated by Mr. Rudisindo Capuyan and for barangay Tibon-tibon and San Vicente the lot is donated by Mr. Manuel Tabuan.

The 35 unit Communal Faucets or Tapstands are distributed to barangay Mindulao and Cabalawan. Eighteen (18) units are allocated for barangay Mindulao, to be installed on Three (3) lot donors, the remaining 17 units will be installed on 9 lot donors for barangay Cabalawan. Right-of-way for transmission and distribution pipe line a PERMIT TO ENTER was signed and approved by lot owners permitting us to buried and lay down the pipe on their respective lots.

#### 7.3) Project Affected Persons (PAP) and their characteristic

Although the area is an agricultural one, the project does not affect any activity for them to earn an income out of their farm products. There are POs at barangays Mindulao and Cabalawan who were beneficiaries of our CFAD projects but the project (Const. of Water Supply) still do not affect in their CFAD proposals, however, if the water supply is greatly available, this will be of great help to their community. Above all, the proposed project do not result to the loss of livelihood or reduced access of families to their traditional livelihood sources.

## 7.4) Existing Land Use of Proposed Structures.

The four (4) beneficiary barangays of the proposed project are predominantly an agricultural land, but, the source of the project is located in the Higaonon Civil Forest Reservation. However, though Higaonon IPs was present in the area, they showed support on the said project.

The proposed spring boxes are located at the foot of the mountain and side of the Hagpa Creek whose land is agricultural. R.C. Tanks will also be constructed at the top of the hill of every respective barangay (Mindulao, Cabalawan, Tibon – Tibon and San Vicente) where dominant use of the land is more on agriculture. Communal faucet will be located along the road right-of-way of the barangay streets and to selected residential lots donated by the lot owner. Aside from their major crops (Coconut, corn and Banana), the farmers were now planting root Crops, Vegetables, and peanut as their CFAD sub-projects.

# 7.5 Consultation/negotiation process with PAP

Several meeting were conducted and MRDP Team even attended barangay assemblies to let them know what the program is all about. Many issues and problems came out, and that their dominant problem is how to acquire potable water supply right at their doorsteps or maybe along their barangay streets where no need for them to fetch water at a far distance. They had the source, about 3 kms from the barangay site of Mindulao, and with no enough funds, this will not reach to the community. This entails big amount, and to them MRDP is the answer.

7.6 Status of right of way acquisition for lands to be used by potable water supply project (DOD, Quit claims, permit to enter/construct/operate, compensation, if any)

The source is within the ancestral domain, but, negotiation between the IPs is already approved or settled with the commitment that the condition they requested (Certification from their Chieftain) be given by LGU Magsaysay. Right – of –way acquisition and any other related settlement/ negotiation pertaining to the proposed potable water supply project was already conducted. That land owners already had signed for the deed of donation and permit to enter.

## 7.7 Social Impact to project beneficiaries and others

- Availability of safe potable water supply;
- Reduce incidence of water-borne diseases:
- Increase income to residents:
- Increase economic activity in the Barangay;
- Generate more jobs opportunities;
- Lesser School drop-outs;
- Uplift standard of living;
- Healthy environment;
- Fresh & Cool minded residents.

#### 7.8 Presence of Indigenous Persons/Communities

There are Indigenous Persons present at barangays Mindulao and Cabalawan, particularly, Ubod Locos Datu Association (UBLODA), accredited under SEC Reg. No. 200200326 by its chieftain, Camilo Ratilla, Jr. of Mindulao, Magsaysay, Misamis Oriental. 10% of the total population were Higaonons and mostly depend on farming as their main source of income. The project was Consulted to them since the source is located inside their ancestral domain, and, they showed willingness to support for the said project.

#### 7.9 Establishment if IPs/IC's are within ancestral domain

Since the project is within an ancestral domain, the LGU Management also has to consider their rights/privileges and policies. During consultations conducted, it is clear that their tribe also abide on the rules and regulation set by the Philippine government. That whatever programs and projects that the government will undertake for the welfare and benefits of the community, they will greatly appreciate and support it hence, they had no objection on the implementation of the Construction of Magsaysay Potable Water supply Level II.

#### 7.10 Status of NCIP applicatio

The local government unit still has to inform and secure necessary certification from any concerned agency. Permit to enter will be secured to ancestral domain area.

# **VIII. Environmental Issues and Mitigation Measures**

# 8.1 Issues and Mitigating Measures

The following are issues frequently associated with Potable Water Supply. Issues include alleged/perceived impacts, potential impacts, health and safety and environment risks.

# 8.2 Status of ECC application, tree cutting permit

This Local Government Unit of Magsaysay has file an application for Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC) to Department of the Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).

Cutting Permit is not applicable for this project because it will not affect to any trees.

#### 8.3 Protection of Watershed Areas.

The municipalities have approved environmental code and ready for implementation.

Planting of Trees in the Watershed areas will be initiated by the Municipal Government and trained Farmers in the area for latest Technologies in farming that apply soil and water conservation for the protection of the spring in order to sustain or improved its volume of water discharge.
