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I. CONDITIONS

A. ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT and MONITORING PLAN (EMMoP)

- All mitigating measures in the submitted Initial Environmental Examination (IEE) Checklist shall be implemented;
- Construction/rehabilitation spoils and debris and other waste generated shall be properly managed and disposed pursuant to Ecological Solid Waste Management Act (RA 9003). Likewise, the proponent shall implement waste minimization, segregation, re-use and other ecological solid waste management practices;
- Adequate slope protection measures shall be provided on steep sloping road cuts and in areas identified with potential risks to erosion to prevent landslides and soil erosion;
- Traffic Management Plan and Spoil Management Program shall be submitted for approval of this Office within thirty (30) days from issuance of this Certificate;
- 5. Planting of native tree species shall be undertaken either within the project site or in other areas as part of the proponent's social and environmental program. The proponent shall submit to this Office within thirty (30) days from the date of approval of this ECC the Tree/Vegetation Plantation Plan which includes quantities and plant species, area/location and planting strategy and management programs, etc.;
- Appropriate mitigating measures to address dust dispersion during road construction shall be implemented (i.e. mobile road water spraying, etc.);

B. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- A mutually agreed upon compensation in case of damages to properties shall be adopted and implemented;
- 8. Copy of Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC) shall be posted in a conspicuous area in the administrative building;
- The proponent shall allow inspection or monitoring that will be conducted by this Office anytime in coordination with concerned groups;
- 10. That should there be any complaint from the community related to environmental pollution and sanitation problem brought about by the project's operation, the proponent shall be held responsible to address such problem;

II. RESTRICTIONS

- 11. In case cutting of trees cannot be avoided, a "Permit to Cut" shall be secured from the DENR-Forest Management Services Region III;
- 12. Any expansion or modification of the approved project components shall be subject to new Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) requirements;

13. In case of transfer of ownership of this project, these same conditions and restrictions shall apply and the transferee shall be required to notify this Office within fifteen (15) days as regards to the transfer of ownership.

Non-compliance with any of the provisions of this certificate shall be a sufficient cause for the cancellation or suspension of this certificate and/or imposition of a fine in an amount not to exceed Fifty Thousand Pesos (50,000.00) for every violation thereof.
